Good news!

Most of you will probably know by now that the interviews at the end of February for a new Team Rector were successful and Rev. Ruth Beckett has been appointed.

She is currently Assistant Curate at Cockington Church, between Torquay and Paignton. She trained at St Melitus College and had previously worked as a maths teacher. She is a quilter and apparently an excellent jam-maker!

She and her husband, John, will be moving to the Rectory in Weare Giffard and will start with us in the middle of July. The date of her licencing by the Bishop of Exeter is still to be confirmed.

Robin and I took the candidates round the churches on the day before the interview and Ruth enjoyed meeting the 'welcome teams' and was so impressed by the warmth of the welcome she received.

We are looking forward to having her with us as much as she is looking forward to joining us.

I hope she and John will be very happy here.

Now more good news!

We are half way through Lent and Easter is approaching fast. We tend to think of Lent as a somewhat dismal time of giving things up or reading serious theological books! But in her sermon last Sunday, Fran put Lent in a different light. I quote a few lines from her talk:-

'It's important to remember that the word 'Lent' comes from the Old English word for 'spring'.

Lent is springtime. It's preparing for the joy of Easter, of new life bursting through death, a time when humanity and justice are brought forward.



We need to prepare ourselves both practically and spiritually for Easter.'

Some of you may have been coming to the Lent courses; others may have been observing Lent in their own way privately. Until Palm Sunday, Lent can be very much a personal observation, but from then on, we are encouraged to journey through Holy Week with others – a pilgrimage with Jesus through the last week of his life.

Details of the services are elsewhere in the Crosslet, but we start Holy Week with a performance of Stainer's Crucifixion at St Mary's at 6 pm on Palm Sunday. Then there are services of different kinds each day taking us through the events of that last week to the Crucifixion on Good Friday and on to celebrating the Resurrection on Easter Day.

If you have never observed Holy Week before, may I encourage you to try it this year. I assure you, you will appreciate Easter in a completely different way.






Ewan will be accompanied by





The Old Corn Mill Weare Giffard

This is the second of three articles on this 'old' building. I say 'old' with a caveat. In my article last month we noted that the plaque on the mill wall states it was rebuilt after the three mills on the site were 'burneth' down



– 1686, but is this current building really of a1868 construction type – it looks much later – another mystery to research!

I mentioned Thomas Fry (1855-1928), one of the last millers. He took over the mill at the quite young age of 27 and almost immediately started upgrading it. One of his main innovations was the installation of a water turbine, which we assume replaced the old waterwheel, the latter we think was 20ft in diameter and 6ft wide, this judged from the wheel pit which was filled in by Chris Slee c1980. Back to Thomas, he installed in 1889, his Victor Turbine provided electricity for the mill, which he also used to light his house – Mill House, or Riversdale as it is today, and this made the mill one of the first buildings in North Devon to have electric lighting.

It was not only the mill that took his attention, he provided Mrytle and Rose Cottages for several of his 7 or so employees – these numbers indicate a big, and important concern. In 1940 the mill stopped producing 'Silver Delight' flour and closed as a mill.

It was purchased by The Moores of Riversdale, farmers, and served various functions both for business and for village socials – the first 'village hall'. It was purchased by Chris Slee and Family in 1978, and converted into a family home and two flats.

In my March article I alluded that Chris had an issue in fencing his newly purchased land. At one point he was unable to drive fence posts into the ground. Something was under the ground! Poets Corner – where, after taking strawberry cream teas on Riversdale's lawn, the ladies walked down Lady Walk to the sluice, this being the point where the leat water could be controlled, either to the mill wheel at the rear, or 'wasted' around the front of the mill, this if perhaps repairs or blockages occurred to the wheel. On behalf of WeAre Friends, a huge shoutout to everyone who attended our event on Wednesday, 5th March! We had a record turnout of 26 people and were captivated by our guest speaker, Lynne, who shared the fascinating story of her parents' lives working for BOAC in Egypt in 1942. 
