Dear friends,

Although we have only just left the season of Epiphany it won't be many weeks before we reach the church season of Lent. This year the theme for our Lent Course is The Nicene Creed which tries to represent concisely in words the core belief of the Christian faith.

Most Anglican churches recite the Nicene Creed every time they have a service of Holy Communion. But sometimes we can become so familiar with the flow and poetry of words we know well, and repeat often, that we fail to focus on what is actually being said and therefore don't question the meaning of the words or even if we fully understand or believe what is being said.

I hope the course will be a relaxed and interesting exploration of the Nicene Creed – what it asks us to believe and the implications for this belief in the 21st Century.

The course is free, open to everyone, and we hope to welcome you either to St Mary's Bideford or Littleham Village Hall. The details of the course are listed below. Best wishes Rev'd Robin

Lent Course The Nicene Creed – Do you believe this?







1,700 years ago church elders met at the First Council of Nicaea to construct and agree a statement of belief for Nicene Christianity. The Nicene Creed still forms part of the profession of faith required of those

undertaking important functions within the Orthodox, Catholic and Lutheran Churches. In Western Christianity the Nicene and Apostles Creed remain the foundation of our faith.

This year the focus of our Lent Course will be to explore the Nicene Creed, what it asks us to believe as Christians, how it has been interpreted over the centuries and how it has been renewed and made relevant for Christians in the 21C.



LITTLEHAM AND LANDCROSS PARISH COUNCIL

Dear Residents,

It is exciting times in the Local Government world with many changes on the way with regard to how the County is structured and funded. A new Combined County Authority has been created and is made up of representatives from Devon Councils and Torbay Council. This new Authority will have new devolved powers and resources.

It means that decisions, previously made in Whitehall, will now be made locally on priority issues, including housing, jobs and skills, transport and the economy. The establishment of the Devon and Torbay CCA is distinct and separate to other government announcements in relation to local government reorganisation and the formation of Strategic Authorities. This is still being discussed so the County Council elections in May will still go ahead.

The Parish Council needs to ensure that its voice is heard with regard to how the devolution programme affects our community and to do this we need 3 residents to fill the Parish Council vacancies. To be able to make the right impact it is important to understand the processes and also engage with representatives of other Councils to ensure Littleham and Landcross are not forgotten!

Other news:-

The legal procedures to define the track known as the Shutta Track as a public right of way and Bridleway should be finalised and accessible by the time the Crosslet is published. To do this the Council has agreed to pay a contractor to clear the path of the overgrowth.

THE OLD CORN MILL, WEARE GIFFARD

This now converted Mill is very likely to be the third oldest building in the village. Research takes us back to 1511 and Henry VIII's time, when from the Court Rolls (i.e. the court held by the Fortescues at Weare Giffard Hall), it was stated that a



certain Roger Saunder was charged by his Lord,' to repair the way between Were and Were Mill – "Were" being The Hall.

The mill leat (man made stream) to drive the waterwheel ran 1.5 miles from Beam Weir. Along the leat there would be sluices, these to control the level/flow of the water – not too much and not too little. We have one example still in sauté near Chopes Bridge. On arriving at the mill, the leat would be controlled by a large sluice, this to control the direction of the flow. If for example the wheel was under repair, the water to it would be cut off by lowering that sluice gate, whilst opening up a second to allow the flow to disperse, in our case via the front of the mill.

Our next piece of evidence is plain to see, situated on the wall of the mill by way of a stone plaque, which states a re-build in 1686 following a fire. So again we see the plural 'mills', why? There are currently two explanations, the obvious being three external waterwheels. However, it could be that the reference is to the number of grinding 'mills' inside, driven by just one external waterwheel, and indeed there were at one time three of these mechanisms, each fulfilling a different grinding function

Finally a small mystery – when the Slee Family purchased and then renovated the Mill in c1977, including infilling the ground floor, Chris had a grounds minor issue, compared with the main building. He could not fully drive into the ground all his boundary fence posts, and if you look carefully at the boundary fence between Riversdale and the mill, there is a slightly raised section of railing, otherwise the rest is completely horizontal.

I will give the likely reason in my next article on the mill, in which I will also look at miller Thomas Fry and his electric turbine, his apple orchard, and other innovations he made.
